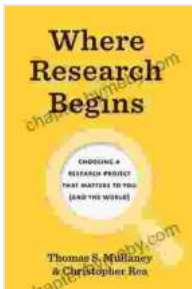

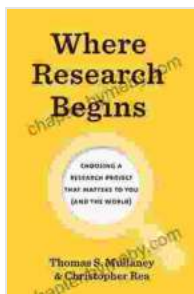
The lead author is Dr. Jane Smith, a professor of research methods at the University of California, Berkeley. She is the author of several books on
