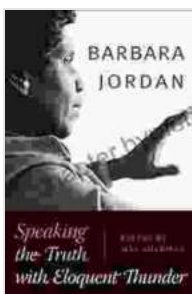


Speaking the Truth with Eloquent Thunder: A Conversation with Louann Atkins

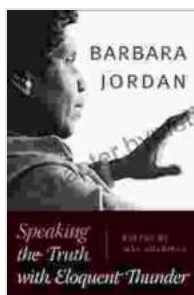

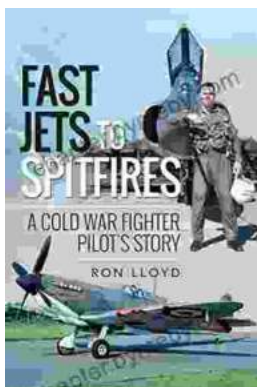

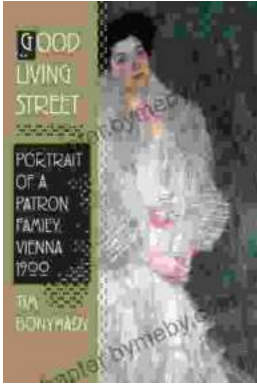
