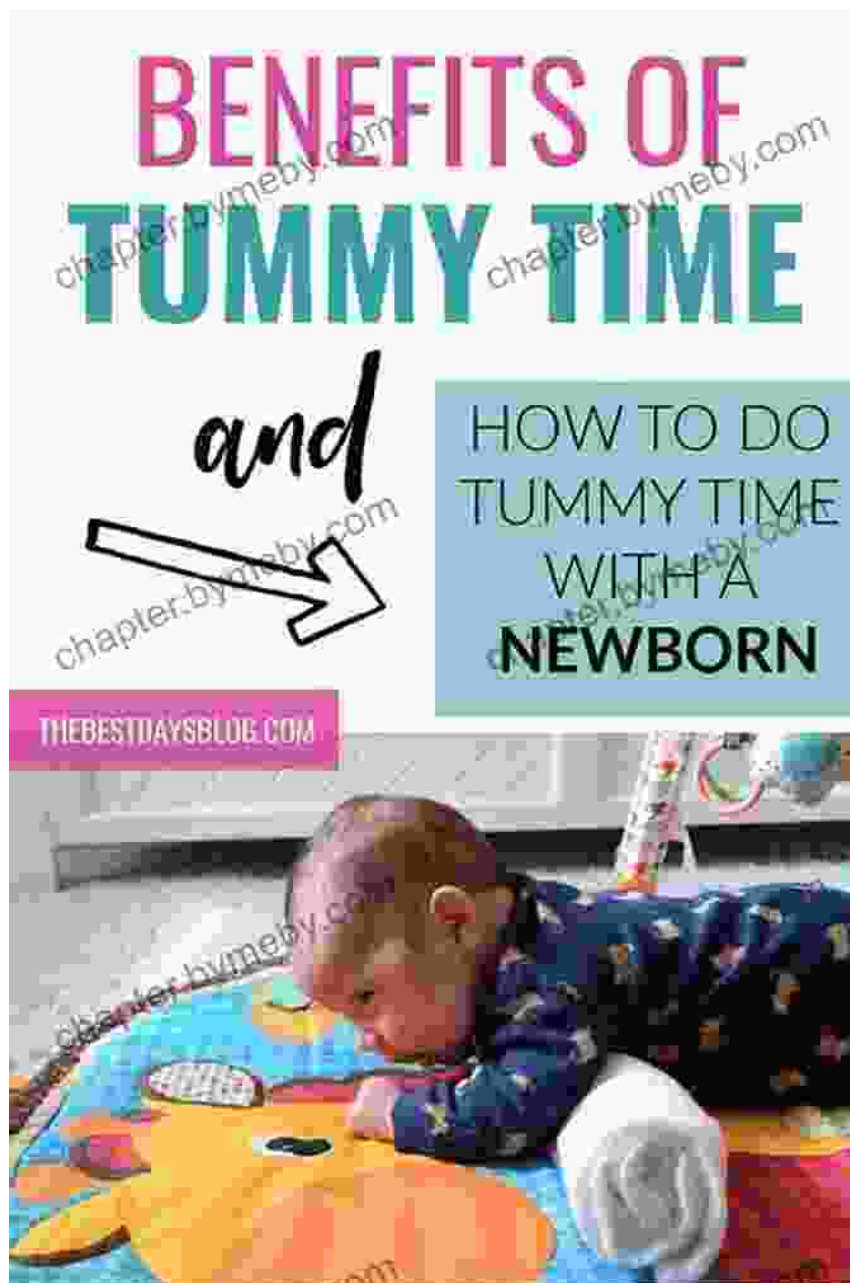


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Bath Time: Create a playful environment during bath time. Sign "water" as you splash gently, and "wash" as you wash their hair.

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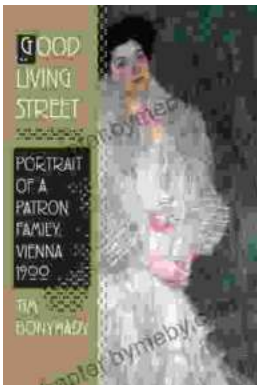
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
